### Dear Parents,

Reading back on last week's newsletter....how quickly can life change in 24 hours? Just when we thought that a 'donut' day saw us heading on the right COVID trajectory, we were called on to implement Remote Learning 6.0. Despite the short notice we are getting more and more efficient at implementing the transition to Remote Learning. The first time we sent all tubs and devices home last year it took us two days to roll out. The last time we sent out all tubs and devices home during the July 2021 lockdown it took us one day. This time we were able to get all 295 tubs and devices out to families in 3.5 hours! How is that for becoming more and more agile!!!

Thank you to the SFX staff who take on these disruptive challenges in their stride. Their acceptance of changes that have been made to the way they operate on a daily basis speaks so much about their professionalism and their desire to always do their best for the students. For many teachers, 'Remote Learning' is never the job they signed up for. Yet they have had to adapt and change....plan things 3 or 4 times only to see them cancelled at the last minute due to lockdowns....balance the priorities of their own

families and children to ensure that learning continues to happen at SFX. Thanks also to the SFX parents who realise that Lockdowns are not a thing of our making, simply accepting that when they are called, parents need to change into another mode for the benefit of the children.

These are unsettling, sometimes troubling and difficult times however we must continue to see that light at the end of the tunnel that keeps us going from day to day. Finally and most importantly thank you to our students for once again demonstrating the school value of 'resilience'. We know that this is not easy or even 'normal', we know that you want to be at school learning with your friends, we know that you do not want to miss out on all the extra-curricular activities that SFX offers, yet you turn up on time to your Google Meets each day, dress in your uniforms, switch on your cameras, join into discussions and do your best to complete set work with the support of your family. We are so proud of you!

### LEARNING IN 'BUBBLES'

One of the clear COVID Directives that came out in the July Lockdown was that students needed to be contained to the same work spaces and play areas both in the normal school day and when the students are participating in Remote @ School. We call this our 'Bubble'. Whilst this is not ideal or fun or even practical in many ways, the directive is aimed at minimising COVID spread in the event of an outbreak at a school.

The timetables and groupings for the current Remote @ School have been designed to separate students who start the week together in the same grouping finish the week together; those who are in for a couple of days go into another grouping. It is a complex task creating these groupings so we are asking that:

- Parents who are eligible to have their children at school because they are not working from home and commit to certain days for Remote @ School ask for days not drop out at the last minute. This often precludes others from the Remote @ School program when we are at capacity.
- Once the booking form for Remote @ School is pushed out to families, you fill it in without delay. Once the form is closed the timetabling of staff and groupings begins for the days ahead and changes/additions cannot be made as ratios and 'bubbles' need to be maintained.
- That students for Remote @ School arrive with a fully charged IPAD/Chromebook, their headphones and their tub.

Parents explain to their children why we are moving in 'bubbles' at present. It is to keep everyone safe, healthy and schools open.

# LOCKDOWN 6.0 WAS TODAY EXTENDED BY ONE WEEK UNTIL NEXT THURSDAY 19<sup>TH</sup> AUGUST. REMOTE LEARNING WILL CONTINUE UNTIL THIS DATE.

### LOCKDOWN 6.0 - THE NEXT PHASE OF REMOTE LEARNING AT SFX

As you are by now aware, lockdown 6.0 has been further extended, something we were all praying would not happen. As such we are going to move to the next phase of Remote Learning for our students.

**Monday, Tuesday, Thursday** and **Friday** will <u>continue to look similar</u> to this week, e.g. live whole class meets, small group meets, group work, independent work in our key learning areas of English, Mathematics, Inquiry & Religion. Classroom teachers will continue to provide you with an outline of the daily expectations the afternoon/evening before and provide your child with both whole class and small class meets so that their learning is supported and continues. Classroom teachers will be available from 8:40am - 3:40pm as per their normal work on these days.

**Wednesday** will see a slight change to **include** <u>Specialist subjects</u>. Classroom teachers will continue to have morning meets on Wednesday, (9am - 11:00am) with some whole class activities, including a wellbeing focus. **From** 11am classroom teachers <u>won't be available</u> as they will use the rest of the day to plan for future learning. This means they will be unavailable to answer emails etc.

This week our specialist team has been working on setting up Google Classrooms for their specialist area and inviting students into these. (Seesaw uploads for Prep). **Beginning on Wednesday 18th**, students may choose to complete specialist activities. These are **optional**, however our teachers have really worked hard to provide some engaging activities for the students and **we encourage** all students to participate in some aspects of specialist subjects. Although Wednesday will be called 'Wellbeing/Specialist Wednesday' it does not preclude your child from choosing a specialist area on the afternoons of other days should they finish classroom work or so choose to do so.

Also beginning next week will be <u>Intervention/Enrichment</u> classes through Google Classroom for those students selected for this program. Parents of those students involved would have been contacted by either Ms Tierney, Ms O'Connor, Ms Cusack, Ms Butler or Ms Godden and they will provide further information about session times to you.

Please note there may be a day where your child's class teacher is required for onsite supervision, at this may impact face to face online lessons. You will be notified if this is the case.
