

This is such an important value at our school. Respect for each other, respect for property, respect for oneself. In a world where we see and hear of so many instances of dis-respect, it is important that we teach 'how' to show respect to the students at SFX. Many will have noticed some new signage around our school where we have linked our school values to a passage from scripture. So the value of **RESPECT** is so beautifully summarized in a simple yet powerful phrase from the Gospel of Matthew:



Even within our own SFX P.B.M school rules all six come out of the value of RESPECT.

- 1. **Follow Directions.** If I listen to my teacher and follow their directions, I am showing **RESPECT.**
- Use your hands, feet and objects in an appropriate way. If I follow the "Hands Off" rule I am showing RESPECT for people's personal space.
- 3. **Listen without interruption.** If I am listening to my teachers and class mates in class and not talking or distracting others, I am showing **RESPECT** for them as I am allowing everyone to learn.
- 4. **Speak appropriately.** If I am showing good manners and saying 'Please' and 'Thank you' this shows **RESPECT** for people I meet.

- Treat all property with care. If I take care of my Chromebook and sports equipment at school I am showing RESPECT to my parents who work hard to pay for my school fees and my peers who use this equipment.
- Move safely around our school. When I am moving safely and quietly between specialist classes, then I am showing RESPECT for others' learning by not disrupting them.

My hope is that one of the reasons parents choose to enrol their child at SFX is that we hold teaching the value of **RESPECT** very highly. We are teaching our students to be the good citizens of today and tomorrow.

### **NEWS FROM OUR STUDENT WELLBEING LEADER**

I hope you had a fabulous Easter! As we come to the end of the month, it's important to highlight that April was Autism Awareness Month—a time when we come together as a community to better understand autism and reflect on how we can create more inclusive, supportive environments for individuals with Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD). At SFX we believe in fostering kindness, understanding, and acceptance for all students, regardless of their differences.

Autism Spectrum Disorder is a developmental condition that affects how individuals experience the world and interact with others. It is a spectrum, meaning that it can present in many different ways, with varying degrees of intensity. Some children may need more support than others, but all children deserve the same respect, understanding, and opportunities to thrive in our school environment. At SFX we provide opportunities that highlight the importance of these values and we reflect on how we can support all of our students to thrive.

We have had very few signatures on our school petition to Banyule Council for the opening up of Mayona Road. This petition was borne out of discussions by our very own SFX School Advisory Council that will greatly increase the access of vehicles and parking around our school, and most importantly safety of our students. If we cannot get at least 200 signatures of people who are directly impacted by the current access to Mayona Road, it will not hold weight with council and it will not proceed.

Just think of what removing this Mayona Road 'road block' will

do.....you will be able to access the school through Woodland Grove and Lillicur Rd both of which run off Calrossie almost tripling the access to our school. Imagine not being stuck



# Good times roll as bowls events grow!






