#### **2025 WONDER OF LIVING HUMAN SEXUALITY NIGHTS**

Once again the Wonder of Living Human Sexuality Nights that we conduct every two years with CatholicCare facilitators were very popular. In total we had 143 families attend over the two nights (P/1/2 session=51, Yr 3/4 session=48, Yr 5/6 session=44) SFX parents are always very appreciative of the sensitive and professional way we deal with matters of teaching human sexuality at our school. Our program acknowledges that parents should always be the prime educators in this area. It is the parent who is best placed to decide when their child and how their child learns about the content matter. We hope that it is a good 'starter' for some rich family conversations that happen within the family home.

#### **VALE SISTER ROSINA – SFX PRINCIPAL 1978 - 1980**

It is always important that we know the history of our school. The Mercy Order of Sisters were responsible for setting up SFX School and many of the schools in the northern suburbs of Melbourne. We recently acknowledged the Mercy Sisters in our new SFX Vision and Mission statement such is the importance of their continuing charism.

Sister Rosina Livingston, who was Principal of SFX in 1978-1980 and who later became a Parish Pastoral Associate passed away last week. Her life was celebrated at a funeral Mass at St Brigid's School Greythorn last Tuesday.

This is an excerpt of an article that was written in a Parish historical anniversary booklet:

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"Father Casamento came to Monty four months after we did, so we were privileged to share all his time in our parish.



## Important Update: Revised Victorian Curriculum Mathematics Version 2.0



Dear Parents and Guardians.

We are excited to inform you about the latest update from the Victorian Curriculum and Assessment Authority (VCAA). The revised Mathematics Curriculum, Version 2.0, is now fully implemented in our school. Here are the key points you need to know:

- **New achievement standards:** The revised Mathematics Curriculum includes changes to the achievement standards used by teachers to assess and report student learning from Foundation to Year 10.
- **Aggregated reporting:** Under the new curriculum, teachers will report against the achievement standard as a whole, providing a single, aggregated score in Semester 1 and Semester 2.
- Alignment with local curriculum: Our school's teacher judgements align with our Mathematics Curriculum program.
- The initial Semester 1 report will <u>only show achievement</u>, while the Semester 2 report will display both achievement and growth for the strands covered in Semester 1.
- **Strand-level information:** Our school has recorded and used information from each of the six strands in Mathematics Version 2.0 to provide feedback on student progress.
- Guidance for reporting: As a school we decided to share strand-level achievement data within
  your child's school report, through outcomes marked against a five-point scale, as has been our
  practise in previous years.
- Holistic judgement: As a school our teachers use learning evidence from the strands taught each semester to make a holistic judgement that accurately reflects where your child is on the learning continuum for Mathematics Version 2.0.

We believe these updates will provide a clear and comprehensive understanding of your child's progress in Mathematics. If you have any questions or need further information, our Mathematics Leader, Sarah Karakaltses, will be holding an informal Q & A session on Wednesday 18<sup>th</sup> June at 9:00am in the staffroom which parents are welcome to attend.



Thank you to those who have already say they will come.


