Dear SFX families.

Welcome back to Semester 2. I hope that all families were able to have some downtime over the past two weeks, get over the winter sniffles, and recharge ready for a HUGE second half of the year.

At assembly on Monday morning I reminded the students of the three goals that their class teacher had set for them for second semester. Also the three goals that each student had set for themselves. Interestingly when comparing the student and teacher set goals, they are often very similar. Students innately know the areas that they need to improve to experience further success at school. Parents can support their child at school if they keep these goals at the forefront of their child's mind. Some parents draw up a goal sheet and place it on their refrigerator....I have seen some parents place a little related reminder of the week in their child's lunchbox. There are so many things that parents can do at home to remain connected to student improvement and be a strong part of this strong home-school partnership.

SCHOOL MUSICAL "PETER PAN"

Rehearsals and preparations are well underway for our Performing Arts spectacular in Term 3. Kristina, our Choreographer, has been teaching the students the class dances and Ms Beamont using her incredible director skills to put the show together.

When we had our last school musical in 2023 out of the 1000 available seats, we only had about 25 not sold across the two nights. That was with a student population of 290. In 2025, we have a student population of 385. So that we do not have to limit seats per family and to deal with our student growth we have added a third and final show.

Some of the questions we are already receiving:

Does my child need to attend all three performances?

Definitely YES. With any school production students are placed on stage in certain positions, dances are choreographed to include all students. Any little change of a child being absent on the night could spoil an entire class act.

As a parent, do I need to attend all three performances?

We hope that parents will attend performances. However students can be dropped off at the theatre at 6pm and picked up at the stage door at 8.30pm. There will be more than sufficient SFX teacher supervision backstage and at the stage door to facilitate this.

My child will be hungry and starve if I drop them off at 6pm?

Each child needs to be fed prior to attending each performance. Normally the students are so excited food is an afterthought. The school will supply a little snack back stage whilst they are waiting for the performance to begin at 7pm. My child will be tired after performing for three

consecutive nights?

Excitement, anticipation, tiredness is all part of a life on the

stage. As in previous years, we are currently working on a late school start (10am) on the Tuesday and the Wednesday, with an optional 'Rest and Recovery' Day on Thursday 11th September. School will be open for regular teaching hours (8.40am to 3.40pm) and Before/After School Oshclub will operate as per normal hours. These arrangements will be confirmed when Mrs. Nolen begins her tenure.

My child has never been on stage before and they are anxious?

Children only become anxious when they are not sure of their dances, their songs and their movements on stage.

All SFX students will be so well rehearsed that they will be confident in how they will perform. Butterflies are quite an acceptable part of performing in front of an audience. I am sure SFX parents who have been to musicals in the past will agree that they are normally astounded by how amazing our Preps are on stage, right through to our Year 5/6 leads who show such incredible maturity and talent.

Minutes from Principal Forum – Term 2 2025 Discussion Points

Review Process

A desktop audit has happened and the Reviewer has come in to begin looking at our policies and procedures.

23rd July will be the initial visit and our new Principal Jo Nolen will be coming in on this day and 30th July (Child Safe Standards Policies and Procedures review)

The idea of the review is to see where we have been, assess where we are at and create a road map for the next four years. It will be a great way for Mrs Nolen to begin and to lead the school with the updated School Improvement Plan.

New Staff beginning in Semester 2

Will there be a handover between teachers?

Response:

Yes. Ms Galllagher has already been in Year 3HS and taught the students. She will also be involved in Parent Teacher Interviews from 2pm-8pm.

Ms Davies has taught 5EG and will also be involved in Parent Teacher Interviews from 2pm-8pm.

We are lucky to have been able to replace both teachers given the current teacher shortage and time frame.

Prep Class sizes for 2026

Parents (Current Year 1 parents who have Prep children beginning in 2026) are concerned that three Prep classes of 25 to 26 is large, even if there is LSO support in each of the three grades. It is 'a lot' to ask teachers to get to know each individual student well with large numbers Like the smaller class sizes, can we go to 4 classes of Prep? Merge the Year 2 classes when they are in Year 3?

Response:

Our current Teaching Award outlines 29 as the maximum class size. We cannot merge the Year 2 classes into two Year 3 classes as this would mean we would exceed the 29 student limit. Whilst 4 classes of 20 seems like a nice class size, there are many factors a school needs to consider, something that Jo Nolen, Leadership team and Consultative Committee will look at in Semester 2.

MACS Vision for Instruction

Given the emphasis seems to be Explicit Teaching/Whole class instruction, how are individual needs met?

Response:

Lessons are not designed for students to sit and passively watch slide after slide etc. Teachers are actively teaching, adapting, and responding to their students. That is what makes the learning engaging and meaningful. When students work independently on tasks these are also modified to suit.






