Performance Week: Schedule Adjustments & Rest Day

Traffic Etiquette

After monitoring the situation for a couple of weeks now it has become apparent that a reminder regarding our protocols for traffic at the start and end of the day are necessary.

- Parents should ensure that they drive slowly and safely into Kiss & Drop when dropping off and picking up their child. Be patient, courteous and conscious of little children who do not have the same peripheral vision and experience around traffic that adults do.
 Parents need to be conscious that we live in a neighbourhood and that we need to respect the rights of neighbours entering and exiting their properties. You can do this by parking legally at all times and never in front of someone's driveway.
- If you choose to park your car in the school carpark for afternoon pick up, you need to enter the carpark before 3:20 pm and you MUST pick up your child from inside the school grounds and walk them safely to your car, using the crossing. At no point are children to be waved across the road to you waiting at the car past Kiss and Drop oncoming traffic. This is a dangerous practice and puts your child's life and that of others at risk. Crossing between the Kiss and Drop cars is also not a wise or safe practice.


