# Indigenous Learning Experience at SFX

Last Term, the students at SFX were lucky enough to have a visit from Uncle Trevor Gallagher, a proud Gunditjmara elder. He led a smoking ceremony accompanied by Matt who played the didgeridoo at our morning assembly on September 18th.





Year One and Two students then participated in a Yarning Circle Incursion with Uncle Trevor to enrich the student's learning of Indigenous Culture and our shared Australian story.

He explained the importance of NAIDOC week, the meaning of the colours on the Aboriginal flag and showed the students some traditional artefacts and what they were used for.

Uncle Trevor discussed what it means to 'yarn' and tell your story. Students were invited to tell their own story amongst their peers.
