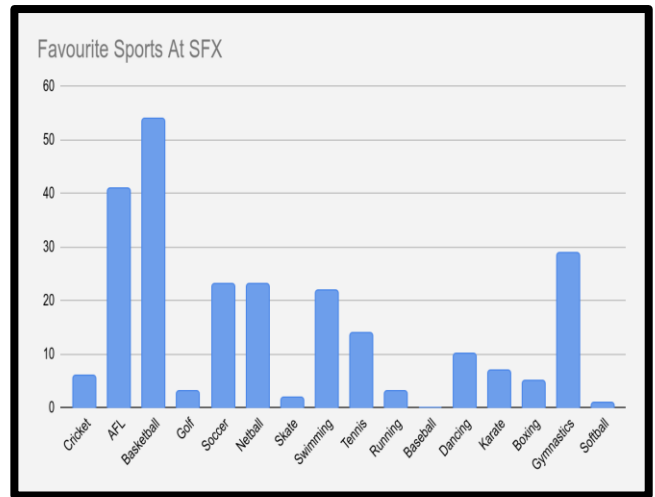

# Blast From The News-Past

Have you ever wondered when the humble newspaper was invented? Or when newspapers reached Australia? Today, all your inquiries will be answered with all things newspaper! As of 2012, more than 3.1 billion people read the newspaper, so it is clear that newspapers are extremely popular around the world.

## Invention:

In 1605, German created a community of journalists, introducing the first European regular published newspaper. This mysterious figure was named Johann Carolus and he wrote stories including brief stories about treaties, battles, the king and recent epidemics. Although, the ancient Romans had the first published newspaper in 59 BCE, they weren't a regular publication. Johann Carolus would only release these newspapers for wealthy subscribers. All newspapers by Johann were hand written and would feature daily updates to inform the townspeople.

## Rise in Australia:

In 1803, a whopping 198 years later and only 15 years after colonisation, The Sydney Gazette and New South Wales Advertiser, published the first printed newspaper in Australia. In the development of Australia, the newspaper was edited and censored by the government. This acted like a filter to strain out all parts that were "inappropriate" to the reader. The government would control ALL stories, hiding news that they didn't want to share with the public. This controlled the news and had to be "approved" before it was published to the population of Australia.

## Readers:

In a survey, researched by "Pew Research Center Organisation", it was found that younger adults are more likely to read the newspaper than elders. It is shown that adults aged from 18-29 make up 42% of the newspaper population when it comes to reading, compared to 65+ matured adults, who make only 27% of the population. This survey shows that most of the growth is from young adults. This means that the newspaper has a stable community and will still thrive in the future. The massive shift is that now newspapers have changed to be featured more digitally than being printed like it was for years.

## Conclusion:

Our school newspaper, "SFX TIMES" is informative and engages our reader, everyone is allowed to write, draw and review freely. Overall our newspaper is outstanding and is highly recommended to anyone.

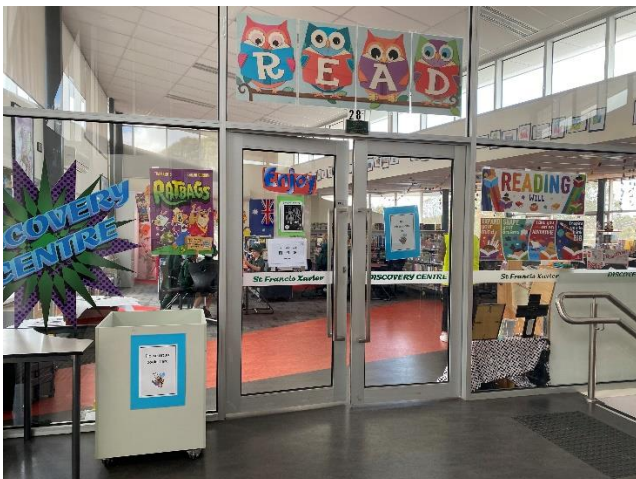

Poppy from 4 AH said she loves the company of friends, the comfort and the quiet reading.

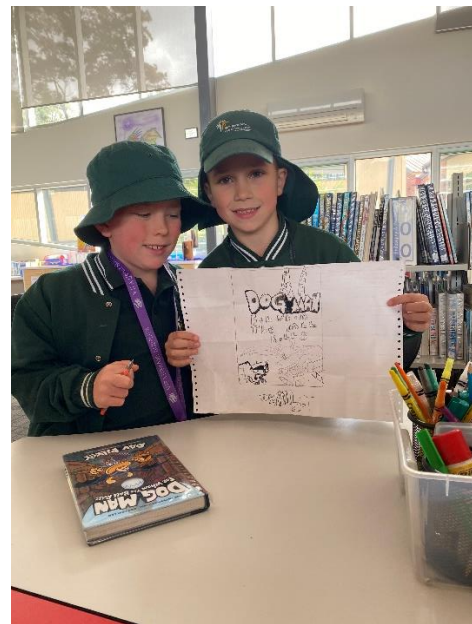

### Why/why not?

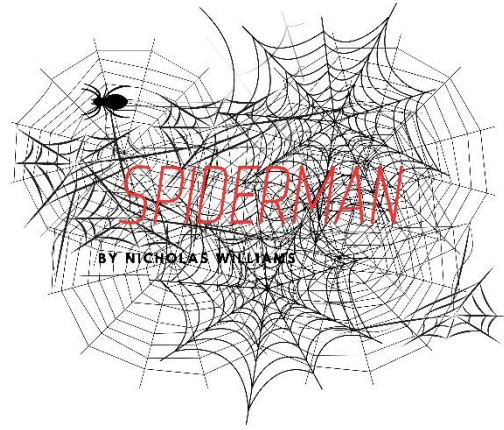
- Yes!

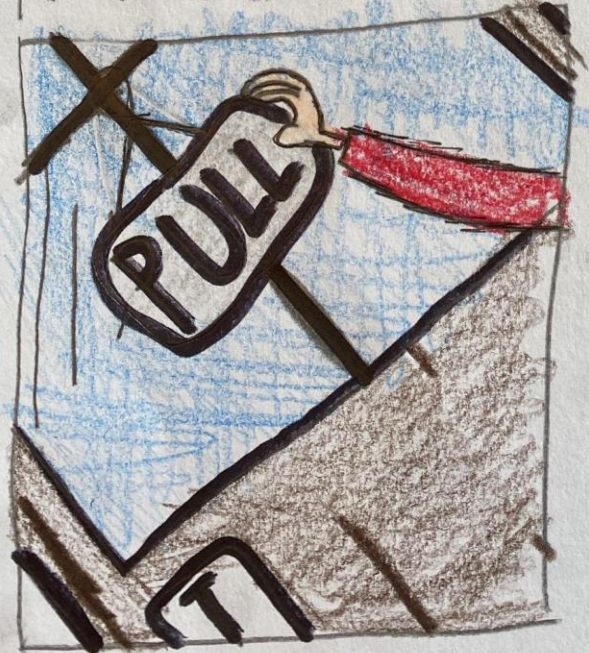

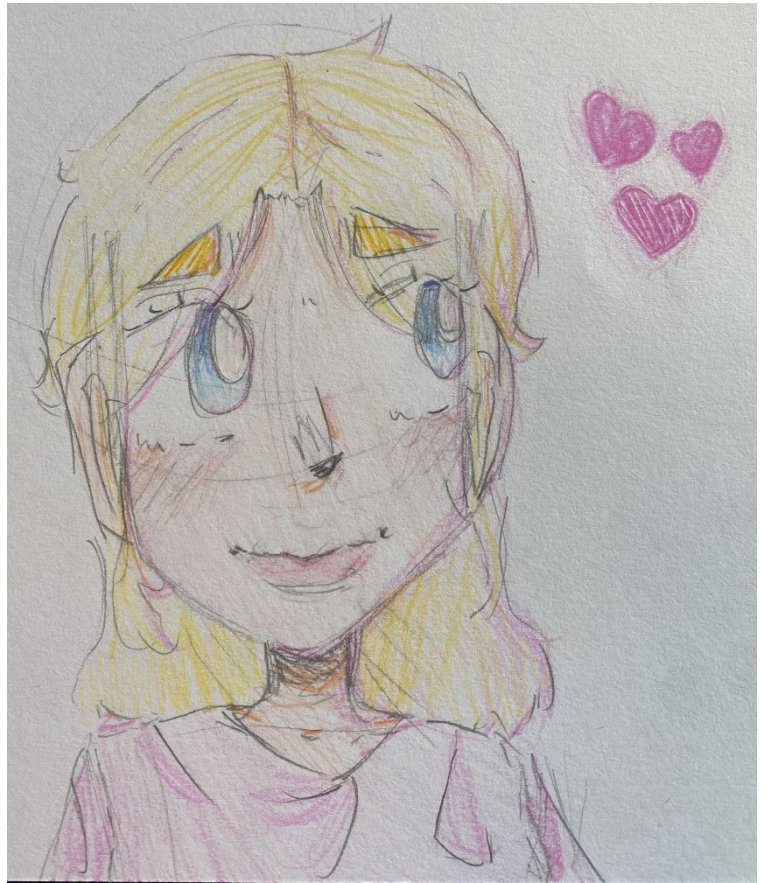

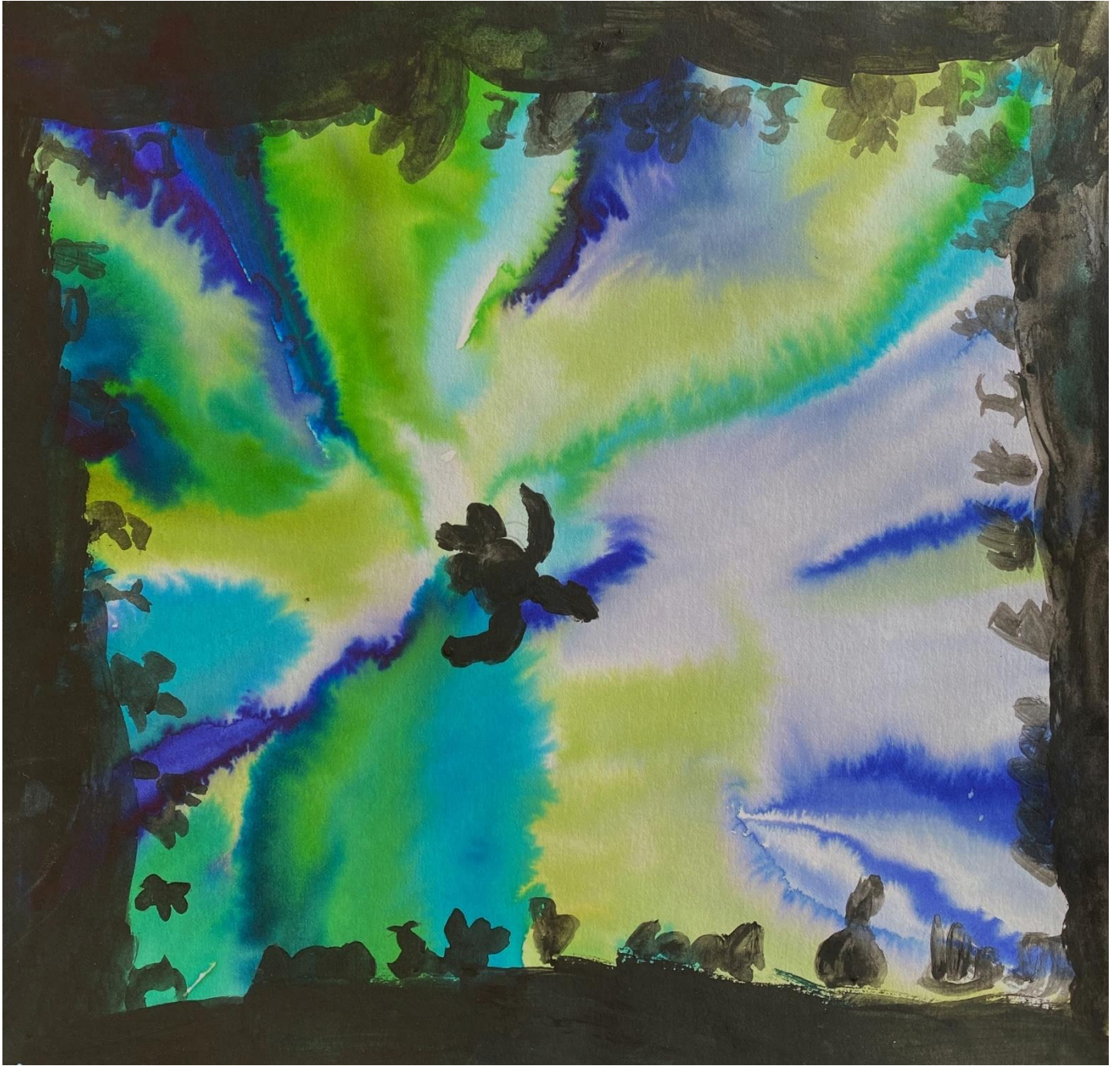
