Welcome back to school and 2025. The Year of Jubilee in the Catholic Church calendar. A year of 200 great school days in the year ahead. We welcome new families to our school. We hope that your stay with us is a rewarding and fruitful experience and that your children flourish in their learning in the years ahead. We welcome all the new staff to SFX school. This year we have added a further 10 staff as a result of the growth in student numbers. We now have 54 SFX staff, who in their own roles, have been looking forward to the beginning of the school year. The students have returned to a fantastic looking basketball/netball court. Thanks to the SFX Parents Association, who with your support, have raised around 50% of the cost of the courts, with the other 50% of the funds being raised in the 2025 school year. 




Our school theme for 2025 is:

SFX SCHOOL PROTOCOLS

St Francis Xavier School goes to extraordinary lengths to keep all children safe and secure. Some of the things you can do as parents to assist in running our school are:

Children are to be at school no earlier than 8.40

a.m. This is when a teacher begins Kiss & Drop Duty and the yard duty teacher goes onto the basketball courts to begin supervision. Don't forget that OSHClub runs a great service to parents and is open from 7am each school day. *(Charges apply – Please be enrolled in the service)*

- Children are to be picked up at the end of the day by **3.40pm.** There will be two staff members rostered on the Kiss & Drop area until 3.40 pm. Any child not picked up by 3.40 p.m. will be taken to OSH After School Care for their own safety (Charges apply Please be enrolled in the service).
- Parents should ensure that if children are running late for school and it is after 8.55am, parents get out of their car and accompany their child to the office to sign the child in using the Passtab machine in the office. Please note that the school gates are locked at 9.15am each day and the only way to access the school after this is through the Mayona Road gate.
- Parents should ensure that they drive slowly and safely into Kiss & Drop when dropping off and picking up their child. Be patient, courteous and conscious of little children who do not have the same peripheral vision and experience around traffic that adults do. Parents need to be conscious that we live in a neighbourhood and that we need to respect the rights of neighbours entering and exiting their properties. You can do this by parking legally at all times and never in front of someone's driveway.
- If you choose to park your car in the school carpark for afternoon pick up, you need to enter the carpark before 3:20 pm and you MUST pick up your child from inside the school grounds and walk them safely to your car, using the crossing. At no point are children to be waved across the road to you waiting at the car past Kiss and Drop oncoming traffic. This is a dangerous practice and puts your child's life and that of others at risk. Crossing between the Kiss and Drop cars is also not a wise or safe practice.
 - If parents have a concern or question, the first port of call is always the classroom teacher. 99% of concerns are resolved at this level. As Principal, I am always happy to meet with parents to discuss any matter or concern, however I limit these Parent meeting times with the Principal to 9 am, 9.30am and 10 am each morning. This allows me to devote equal times to other parts of my work: the staff, the students, administration and observing student learning. I will always ask whether you have spoken to the teacher FIRST about an issue, prior to coming to me with a concern or question.

THE MOST IMPORTANT SCHOOL PROTOCOL FOR PARENTS

Parents should never approach a child or the parents of that child about a school related matter.

If a parent has a concern or issue they must always raise this with the classroom teacher.

Your child's safety and security are paramount.

Please consider the implications of not following these school expectations.

STUDENT ABSENCES



If your child is going to be absent from school it is important that you go onto the school website and click the "ABSENCE" button. Fill in the required information and send. It is crucial that you do this **BEFORE** 9 a.m when attendance rolls are taken in all classes. Under Victorian Government legislation you will be informed by SMS if your child has not arrived at school and you have not informed the school by email or by phone. The form that you fill in on the website also forms part of the Student Absence documentation required to be kept by schools for the next 7 years.

POSITIVE BEHAVIOUR MANAGEMENT 2025

St. Francis Xavier School expects high standards with student behaviour at all times. This allows all students to learn in a happy and safe school environment. The students of SFX are very well versed on the four values of being **Respectful**, **Resilient**, **Responsible & Kind**. (Parents will have noticed that we have changed one of our school values to "KIND". This came out of consultations with the SFX community, in particular the students, when devising our Vision/Mission statements last year)

Underlying these values is always a set of rules and expectations that make our school and learning spaces happy and productive for all. There are six school rules for the children to follow and my #1 expectation which is "Hands Off!". When followed this prevents about 95% of all problems and injuries that occur at school.

- 1. Follow all directions
- 2. Use your hands, feet and objects in an appropriate way
- 3. Listen without interruption
- 4. Speak appropriately
- 5. Treat all people and property with care
- 6. Move safely around the school

As part of this week's learning, students have been breaking open what our values and school rules mean to them. I would ask that all parents reinforce these values and rules with the children, maybe even using them as a springboard at home as they have always been shown to have a dramatic effect on improving student behaviour.

Each term we also focus on one of our school values, to better understand what it means and reward students who show these values in day to day school life.

UPDAT-ED: THE SFX SCHOOL APP



Updat-Ed is part of our communication and Emergency DISPLAN system here at school. We are able to communicate instantly with parents through PUSH NOTIFICATIONS. The Updat-Ed app is free and is downloaded from the App Store. Newsletters and other important information is shared with any school parent who has a mobile phone. Please take the time to download the App especially if you are a busy parent who just needs a little prod every now and then through a PUSH NOTIFICATION (like me!!!!)

SCHOOL NEWSLETTER

The School Newsletter will be published on a weekly basis in 2025 and distributed on a Thursday. It is our main form of communication with families and it is important that families read it to keep up to speed with what is happening at school. Many of the calls the office takes each week are questions that have been addressed in the weekly school newsletter. So that we have comprehensive coverage across all families, weekly newsletters will be published in **five** forms;

- 1. Newsletter in hardcopy. If you wish to opt out of a hardcopy newsletter each week please email principal@sfxmontmorency.catholic.edu.au. I understand that environmental reasons may be of concern, but for some a newsletter that sits on a kitchen counter at home until it gets read is better than an email that will simply get deleted or sit in a spam folder.
- 2. **Newsletter by email.** If you go onto the School website at www.sfxmontmorency.catholic.edu.au there is a button where you can subscribe to this feature. This is our E-Newsletter.
- 3. Newsletter on the School website. Go to the School Newsletter button to view the current and past newsletters
- 4. Newsletter on the SFX Updat-Ed App directly to your mobile phone
- 5. Newsletter on the SFX Parents Association Facebook **site** is uploaded each week.

By publishing the weekly school newsletter in these five formats we get maximum communication coverage and then there are few excuses from parents to say that they were not informed.

SFX - A SUNSMART SCHOOL-SEPTEMBER TO APRIL

Children at our school must wear a school hat at recess and lunchtime until the end of April. Children also wear a hat during sports lessons. This will have great benefit in the years to come when the chance of having skin cancers and melanoma are greatly reduced. The children know our slogan: "NO SCHOOL HAT MEANS NO PLAY". Children who do not have a school hat must sit on the seats in the shaded play area on the upper playground rather than play with their friends around the playground.

CSEF - CAMPS, SPORTS AND EXCURSION FUND

For those families who hold a current and valid Health Care Card, the Victorian Government gives you \$125 per year that you can pay towards your Student Levy (excursions) and School Camp if your child is in Year 3,4,5 or 6. This really assists those families who may struggle to send their child to school camp or pay for the excursion component of their Student Levy. All you need to do is produce a copy of your Health Care Card at the office and fill in the attached link. It's as easy as that....all families, even those who filled in the form last year, must fill in the 2025 form to qualify.
