### **SCHOOL MUSICAL 2021 - ROCK BOTTOM**

It is with deep regret that we are going to have to cancel our two night school performance at the Loyola College Theatre on 12<sup>th</sup> & 13<sup>th</sup> August. SFX Montmorency has not had a school performance since 2018 and we were so looking forward to showcasing our students' talents in the Performing Arts area.

Some of the reasons for making this difficult decision are:

- Loyola Theatre is fully booked for the remainder of the year. This includes Saturdays and Sundays.
- Planet Shakers, a venue that we have used in the past, is not accommodating external audiences and is classed as a religious congregation site. As such it must abide by the same COVID restrictions as SFX Church in terms of density limits.
- Tickets should have gone on sale last week, however there is currently no definition from the Victorians Government around whether a 25%, 50%, 100% capacity on theatres will be allowed surrounding the current Lockdown 5.0. Historically it has taken the Victorian Government five full weeks of zero COVID cases to go from full Lockdown to a COVID normal way of life. That brings us almost to the end of Term 3.
- Ms. Wilson our Performing Arts teacher, our classroom teachers and Kristina Diaz our Choreographer were well organized in terms of concert rehearsals. However you cannot expect that taking 5 full weeks out of a rehearsal schedule will not have an impact on the final product and the confidence of the students to perform in front of an audience. We will always put on a School Performance that reflects high standards when we are selling tickets to such an

- event and we want to ultimately put on a performance we are truly proud of.
- Performances such as these are costly. Theatre hire costs alone are in the vicinity of \$10,000 per night. In order for the school not to wear a massive financial loss on the night, at least a 50% audience capacity is what is required.

We have gone through many scenarios and possibilities as to how we would not waste the great energy, the props, the costumes, the rehearsals, the hours of time it takes to put on a school performance that involves over 290 students.

## **HOWEVER**

The adage "The Show Must Go On" sits well with our determination and school value of Resilience. That no matter how many road blocks have been thrown our way over the past 18 month we can find another way and we keep bouncing back. We are currently going through a series of possibilities to stage "Rock Bottom" in some alternative form this year. We will need good fortune....we will need COVID to help rather than hinder our efforts....we will need prayer....we will need your positive support.....

## CHILD INFORMATION SHARING AND FAMILY VIOLENCE REFORMS

From 19 April 2021 (Term 2), all Victorian government and non-government schools and centre-based education and care services (e.g. long day care, kindergarten and outside school hours care) will be prescribed as Information Sharing Entities under the Victorian Government's Child Information Sharing Scheme (CISS) and Family Violence Information Sharing Scheme (FVISS). These information sharing schemes have expanded the ability of schools and services to collaborate and share relevant confidential information with other authorised Information Sharing Entities to promote the wellbeing and safety of children, and to assess and manage family violence risk. Information can only be shared under the schemes by organisations prescribed as Information Sharing Entities. The information sharing schemes were introduced in response to Royal Commissions, coronial inquests and independent inquiries over the past decade that identified poor information sharing as a barrier to service collaboration with detrimental outcomes for children and families. **Phase 1** of implementation of the schemes commenced in September 2018 and included key services, such as Child Protection, Maternal and Child Health Services and Victoria Police, From 19 April 2021, as part of **Phase 2**, universal services such as education and health will be authorised to share information using the schemes.

The information sharing schemes complement and expand upon existing information sharing and child protection laws, and do not replace already existing authorisation to share information such as the Child Safe Standards, reporting to Child Protection or Victoria Police, the Reportable

Conduct Scheme, and other privacy and information sharing laws.



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### Book Week - 2021 here we come !!!!



Term 3 is always exciting in the Discovery Centre as this is when we celebrate Book Week. This annual event highlights the importance of reading and draws on the joy of stories and creativity of Australian authors.

In DC lessons we will be unpacking the theme for 2021 "Old worlds, New worlds, Other worlds". We will look at books set in past times (historical fiction) and old cultures. Students will explore stories set in the future with new ideas and new thoughts and will delve into other worlds - fantasy and science fiction

worlds and look at the worlds of other people and cultures. As many of us have had to cancel or postpone travel plans recently, books have offered us the opportunity to visit other worlds. Books can be our spaceships or our time machines - they can take us to the far side of the universe or to places in the distant past or future.
